COVID-19 Travel Advice

We are looking forward to welcoming you at inlingua Malta!

As we face this changing situation together, we would like to update you on the latest travel information, advice and conditions in case of closure or quarantine due to COVID-19.

Travel Requirements from/to Malta

Currently all travelers arriving at the Malta International Airport are required to have one of the following vaccination certificates: Malta's Vaccination Certificate, EU Vaccination Certificate, NHS UK Vaccination Certificate, Turkish Vaccination Certificate or the Dubai Vaccination Certificate (this list is being updated) all showing 14 days since the last dose. If you do not possess one of these you will need to go into mandatory quarantine in a specific quarantine hotel.

This is a changing situation so it always best to check the requirements again before travelling to Malta!

It is recommended to follow entry requirements back to your country and that you are aware of these before travelling. In case you require a PCR test (and not a Rapid Test) we will send you all the relevant information during your last week of study at inlingua Malta!

What happens in case one of your classmates tests positive to COVID-19?

inlingua Malta has adapted to the Government Guidelines and has put in place several measures including socially distant classrooms, mask-wearing at all times, hand sanitization facilities and temperature checking. It is also recommended that students who are staying in Malta for more than 4 weeks get tested every 2 weeks – this can be done for free and the information on how to do this will be provided upon arrival. All our students have the opportunity to take the vaccination in Malta!

In case there is a positive case in class, Public Health Officials will ask the class or those who sit close to the positive case in class to go into Mandatory Quarantine for 14 days.

Classes will automatically shift to online learning. We will also advise our students on how to access food supplies via delivery to their door, how to sanitize their living space and how to keep mentally safe throughout this quarantine period.

How can inlingua students take a COVID-19 Test for Free in Malta?

All language travel students in Malta can book a PCR test online by visiting <u>https//covidtest.gov.mt</u>. Once the online form is filled in, students will receive an email confirmation of the booking. Later on they will then receive an appointment for the test. Students can also request transport to the swabbing center as they would not be able to go via public transport. This service is provided for free! It is in fact recommended that students who are staying for more than 4 weeks do this every 2 weeks!

What happens in case of language school closures or lockdown in Malta?

In case of language school closures or lockdown, inlingua Malta can shift to online learning until schools are reopened once again. In this case, all lessons will continue and the programme of study will not be changed. All our teachers are trained to shift to online lessons so you will continue to follow lessons with the same teacher!
